If you believe that in this rich country no one should be homeless, living on the streets or in shelters, then take action to support Bill C-400. [Bill C-400](#) is a private member's bill currently before Parliament that addresses the crisis of homelessness and inadequate housing in Canada. It calls for federal leadership on the development of a national housing strategy using a human rights framework and bringing together many stakeholders. The Bill is currently at second reading in the House of Commons and will be referred to Committee - the crucial next step in the legislative process - if a majority vote is received. The Bill has the support of all opposition parties.

Now is the time to put your values into action! Debate is scheduled for February 13, 2013 followed by a vote scheduled for February 27, 2013.

Aboriginal peoples across the country “**as a result of historic and current policies marked by paternalism, the dispossession of aboriginal peoples’ lands and resources, and the denial of their self-determination and sovereignty**”. Noting that Aboriginal peoples disproportionately experience poverty, inadequate housing and homelessness, hunger and ill health, the article remarked, “**It is deeply disturbing that anyone is treated this unequally in a country such as Canada.**”
